

# PUPIL PREMIUM STRATEGY 2017/18

## Learning in the Curriculum

- Employment of a teacher to provide separate teaching for Core Subjects for identified Year 6 children who are low attaining.
- Employment of a Teaching Assistant within every class to deliver interventions in English and Maths to all children as appropriate.
- Employment of one trained Teaching Assistant to deliver Reading Recovery intervention in Year 1.
- After-school booster classes delivered by teachers for Year 6 children.
- Employment of a speech and language intervention Teaching Assistant (0.5).
- Provision of the Speech and Language Link Programmes and resources.
- Purchasing of Reading Eggs to support word reading and comprehension as an intervention within school and at home.
- Additional training for teaching assistants in delivery of intervention programmes (E.g. high five, Fun Fit, Phonics etc.)
- Library Assistant employed for one afternoon a week to support with reading activities in the library and support families in the library after school.
- Employment of Teaching Assistant to work with Pets as Therapy to encourage reluctant readers.
- Employment of a Teaching Assistant (0.5) to deliver interventions to children in Y2, 4 and 5.
- Additional teaching assistants employed to work within the Foundation Stage and Y1 setting to deliver early intervention and provide early support.
- Extra-Curricular clubs delivered to target children who are under-attaining and the most-able pupils.

## Social, Emotional and Behaviour Support

- Funding for 2 x MTAs to facilitate playground stimulation and support the development of social skills with identified pupils.
- Thrive interventions delivered by a full-time, licensed Learning Mentor.
- Support for pupils from the North Devon Behavioural Team.
- 2x trained Emotional Literacy Mentors and 5 trained Attachment Mentors delivering interventions.



## Families and Communities

- Subsidised access to residential visits, trips, and/or uniform.
- Providing stationery and resources for homework.
- Access to the Computer Suite afterschool for parents.
- Learning Mentor to work with vulnerable families both in school and at their homes.
- Links made with the rotary club (Rota Kids) to create links for families within the community.
- Provision of 2 licensed Family Thrive practitioners and 12 weeks of Family Thrive workshops for parents.

## Enrichment beyond the Curriculum

- Provision of a subsidised breakfast bar.
- Subsidised access to residential visits, trips, and/or uniform.
- Funding of enrichment workshops (both in-school and out) for the Most Able pupils.
- Resourcing for multisensory thrive studio to enable children to engage with Learning Mentor activities effectively
- Provision of a school pet for sensory, speech and language and SMSC development.
- Trips to the town centre for individuals; to develop life skills.
- Provision of resources for cookery club.
